In the last few days, the St. Lucie team has achieved a few successes worthy of celebration.

For the first time in our site's history, Unit 1 has achieved all points on the INPO Index. This achievement was the result of integrated crossfunctional efforts by our entire team. We never could have reached this achievement if every member of the team wasn't pulling in the same direction and focused on equipment reliability, strong operational focus and leadership excellence.

The Unit 2 rad monitor computer system was a complete upgrade of the PC-11 computer system that removed an antiquated 386 computer system. This system was redesigned from scratch without any outside help. The system has performed excellent since installation and there is positive acceptance from Operations. This was a great job by the project team, Engineering and I&C Maintenance and demonstrates a strong bias for action.

In addition, the Unit 1 Fuel Handling Building rad monitor and Unit 1 plant vent rad monitor project replaced obsolete rad monitors with state of the art equipment supported by a leader in the radiation monitoring industry.

These are three more site successes that demonstrate how far the St. Lucie team has come in resolving repeat issues, and how we can achieve anything when we focus on teamwork and PSL.

Flammable Liquids

When transferring flammable or combustible liquids from the original shipping container, transfer only to a properly labeled safety can (in quantities greater than 1 gallon). Small quantities may be placed in properly marked application containers for immediate use. The motors of all equipment being fueled shall be shut off during the fueling operation (unless specified by manufacturer's instructions).
